Weather

Port Townsend and Gray Wolf Ranch is located in the “banana belt.” This climatological phenomenon is created by prevailing winds and the Olympic mountains and results in significantly lower annual rainfall than the rest of Puget Sound (about 40% less than Seattle).

Laundry

There is a washer, dryer and ironing station in the room adjacent to the cottage suite. Your room key accesses the laundry area. Laundry supplies (soaps, softeners etc.) are

stocked for your convenience.

Groceries, etc.

Port Townsend
There is a **QFC** (515 Sheridan Avenue) just left off Sims Way/Hwy. 20 (the main road into town) before you descend into Port Townsend, and a **Safeway** (442 West Sims Way) on the left at the bottom of this same hill. You can rent movies at Safeway if you have a Club Card. If you continue along Sims Way to the next stoplight and go left you will see the **PT Food Co-op** (414 Kearny), which we highly recommend. It is open to everyone, but if you belong to another food co-op be sure to show your card for the discount. Keep going along Kearny to get to **Provisions** (939 Kearney), a neighborhood delicatessen

with imported regional foods, house-made dinners and sweets prepared daily. This is a good spot for picnic fixings. Another local grocer with a nice deli is **Aldrich's** (940 Lawrence St.) in the Uptown neighborhood. A **Farmer's Market** is on Saturdays from 9:30am-1:30pm (May - Oct) and Wednesdays from 3:30pm-6:30pm (mid-June - Sept) in front of the Community Center in Uptown, on the corner of Tyler and Lawrence streets. This is also the location of Badd Habit, the screenprinting and retail shop associated with Gray Wolf Ranch. The best bread in Port Townsend is **Pane d'Amore**, also in Uptown (617 Tyler St.) off Lawrence St. **Live seafood** is available 11-6 Monday-Friday on the waterfront near the boat haven, just across from T's Restaurant – follow the signs for “Live Crab” (2330 Washington Street). Or, go to **Key City Fish** (right at the Safeway stoplight into Boat Haven).

Sequim

If you take a day-trip to Sequim, stop in at **Sunny Farms Country Store** (261461 Hwy 101 West) for a great selection of produce, meat, deli items and bulk foods. You can also purchase farm-fresh produce directly from **Nash's Organic Produce Farm Store** in Sequim (1873 East Anderson Road).

Movie Theatres

The Rose Theatre (235 Taylor Street, 360-385-1089) is a beautifully restored historic gem and features popular new releases and art-house films. Great popcorn and gourmet concessions.

The Uptown (on Lawrence and Polk Streets, 360-385-3883) is an *unrestored* historic movie theatre featuring popular new releases in one evening showing. The guy who owns the Uptown also owns the **Wheel-In Motor Movie** (210 Theatre Road-off Highway 20 near the airport, 360-385-0859), a drive-in theatre operating on summer nights.

Olympic Music Festival

From late June through early September, chamber music performances are held at this turn-of-the-century dairy farm nestled on 55 acres of tranquil farmland every Saturday and Sunday afternoon at 2pm. Book advance tickets if you would like a seat in the barn, but the lawn is perfect for a picnic and does not require advance reservations.

Port Townsend Gallery Walks

On the first Saturday of every month, galleries and venues in the downtown waterfront district show off the work of local artists. Gallery Walks encourage exploring the many nooks and crannies of the town's historic center.

Land Adventures

Anderson Lake State Park

Hiking, biking, boating, fishing and bird-watching

Take SR 20 south, then turn east on Anderson Lake Road. Proceed 1.1 miles to park entrance.

Anderson Lake State Park is a remote marine day-use park of cedar, fir and alder forest mixed with freshwater marshes. Surrounded by 410 wooded and wetland acres, the park slopes down to the 70-acre Anderson Lake and abounds with birds and wildlife.

Chetzemoka Park

Picnicking, strolling through gardens

Jackson and Blaine Streets off of Monroe Street

This idyllic 5+ acre park, located on the hillside overlooking Admiralty Inlet, has a beautiful view of the Cascade Mountains. The keystone of Port Townsend's parks, this Victorian park was established in 1904. There are beautiful flower gardens, a tropical water garden, picnic areas and shelter, and a playground to enjoy. There is also access to the park's beach and extensive tidelands.

Dungeness Spit

Beach-walking, picnicking, bird watching

The longest natural sand spit in the United States, the Dungeness Spit extends 5 miles out into the Strait of Juan de Fuca. It is located just north of Sequim, approximately one hour's drive to the West. The Dungeness National Wildlife Refuge, a key staging area for over 200 species of birds, encompasses the spit. The 631-acre refuge is open daily from dawn to dusk with access limited by foot or horseback only.

Fort Flagler State Park

Hiking, biking, picnicking, boating, fishing, crabbing, clamming, museum

Located eight miles northeast of Hadlock on the northern tip of Marrowstone Island. Fort Flagler State Park is a 784-acre marine camping park surrounded on three sides by 19,100 feet of saltwater shoreline. The park rests on a high bluff overlooking Puget Sound, with views of the Olympic and Cascade Mountains. Many historic buildings remain at this 19th-century-established military fort.

Fort Worden State Park

Hiking, biking, beach-walking, museums, bunkers

Fort Worden State Park overflows with places of interest to visit, study and explore. The gun batteries, or "bunkers," were the heart and purpose of the fort and fill the hillside above the main fort grounds. The park also has over two miles of shoreline on Puget Sound and the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Point Wilson is the dividing line between these two bodies of water, and gives the park two distinct beaches. There are also a number of museums within the park:

- ***Coast Artillery Museum***

This museum is dedicated to the preservation and interpretation of the history of the US Army's old Coast Artillery Corps, with special emphasis on the Harbor Defense of Puget Sound.

- ***Commanding Officer's Quarters***

A visit to this historical house with its 12 rooms of outstanding late-Victorian antiques will give you the opportunity to experience what life might have been like for an officer's family on an early 20th century military base.

Larry Scott Memorial Trail

Walking, jogging, biking

From the Boat Haven and along Port Townsend Bay.

A section of abandoned railway grade was converted to a trail that could eventually

extend all the way to Port Angeles, providing one of the most scenic routes for alternative travel on the Olympic Peninsula. The entire system inside the city limits is 9.2 acres of designated open space along wetlands and shoreline of Port Townsend Bay.

Marine Science Center

Get up close to the marine world with a chance to touch sea life. Newly renovated and expanded, the Port Townsend Marine Science Center offers education, boat tours, summer campout and exhibits throughout the year. The new Natural History Exhibit is open for public exhibit every Thursday through Sunday (year round) from 12:00pm – 4:00pm with public interpretive programs at 2:30pm daily.

North Beach Park

Beach-walking, hiking, picnicking

On Kuhn Street past the fairgrounds.

The 1 acre of waterfront is one of the few public access beaches on the north end of the Quimper Peninsula. It is an excellent beachcombers' starting point for walks in either direction. The park adjoins Fort Worden State Park making this park a popular destination for hikers. The site includes mowed grass area, rest rooms, picnic shelter, water and parking.

Olympic National Park

Hiking, backpacking, camping, picnicking, scenic drives

One of America's most beautiful National Parks. Hwy 101 provides the main access to the park, with numerous spur roads leading to the interior. No roads pass through the heart of the Olympics. Ninety-five percent of Olympic National Park is designated wilderness, and over 600 miles of trails provide access to these wild areas. The largest remaining undisturbed old-growth and temperate rain forests in the Northwest are found in Olympic National Park. This park is a delight from the sky to the sea: jagged, glacier-capped peaks rise nearly 8,000 feet above sea level, and the park contains over 60 miles of wild Pacific coast. Hurricane Ridge is the most easily accessible and popular entry to the Olympics and makes for a great day trip at about one hour and a half drive from Port Townsend to the top. It is 5,230 feet above sea level, provides spectacular views and numerous walking and hiking trails for all fitness levels. Even if you're not a hiker, it's worth the drive up here for the views from the lodge.

Rothschild House

One of the smallest State Parks in the state, this well-preserved home showcases common life in Port Townsend during the mid 1800's. Open to the public for self-guided tours daily 11:00am – 4:00pm, May through September.

Golf Courses

Discovery Bay Golf Club

The Discovery Bay Golf Club is the Pacific Northwest's oldest public course. The course boasts commanding views of Discovery Bay, Mount Baker and the Olympics. Play this 18-hole, 6,753 yard, par 72 course year round. Full facilities, including a driving range, putting green, club and cart rentals.
